

Lifesaver

How does Project Lifesaver work?

Project Lifesaver relies on radio technology and specially trained Sheriff's Officers. Clients that are enrolled in the Project Lifesaver program wear a personalized wristband that emits a tracking signal. This one-ounce battery operated radio wristband-like transmitter emits an automatic tracking signal every second, 24 hours a day. Each wristband has a unique radio frequency. The Sheriff's Office Project Lifesaver Task Force is equipped with special tracking equipment that can receive each radio frequency up to about one mile. In the event that a client becomes missing, the caregiver will immediately call 911 and the task force will be deployed to the client's point last seen.

Statistics

About Alzheimer's Disease

- Alzheimer's Disease strikes an estimated 4.2 million to 5.8 million Americans
- It is estimated that one to four family members act as caregivers for each individual with Alzheimer's Disease
