SOMERSET COUNTY - 2026

Somerset County is at the hub of central New Jersey. Its 21 municipalities, which encompass 305 square miles, contain diverse landscapes, population, and development that reflect the varied lifestyles of its estimated 357,467 residents.

As one of America's oldest counties, Somerset is steeped in colonial and Revolutionary War history. The county was established by charter on May 22, 1688, with land conveyances dating to 1651. Historic sites, monuments, and buildings are found in virtually every town, preserved for future generations.

Located in the heart of the nation's largest metropolitan area, with convenient access to New York and Philadelphia, Somerset County contains a balance between urban and suburban neighborhoods and rural countrysides. Fine residential communities, beautiful parks, excellent shopping areas, extensive farmlands, numerous historic sites, and outstanding business and industry all make Somerset County a desirable place to live, work and play.

The county has 15,228 acres of land preserved for recreational and conservation purposes, including golf courses, picnic areas, hiking and bicycling trails, stables, a swimming pool, an Environmental Education Center, and the county's fairgrounds that host the annual Somerset County 4-H Fair. Additionally, a total of about 10,769 acres of farmland has been preserved countywide.

Our educational facilities – Raritan Valley Community College (RVCC) and Somerset County Vocational & Technical High School – are among the finest in the state. RVCC, a two-year college in Branchburg, includes a state-of-the-art Workforce Training Center, library/theater complex, a conference center, fitness center, science center, and planetarium.

Many boards, commissions, and advisory groups help the County Commissioners determine priorities and procedures in areas ranging from farmland preservation to providing human services. These Board Members, who serve without compensation, perform a valuable service to their communities.

Environmental protection, conservation of resources, shared services, and proper planning for future growth and development – all are major goals for county government. The Board of County Commissioners remains dedicated to serving the residents of Somerset County and to maintaining the county's nationwide reputation for excellence.

THE ROLE OF COUNTY GOVERNMENT

“What is a County Commissioner?”

Somerset County is governed and managed by a Board of County Commissioners. The board consists of five members with one or two elected each year from the County at large to serve three-year terms.

County Commissioners elect from among themselves a Director who conducts their meetings. The other Somerset County Commissioners each chair a standing committee reflecting the structure of county government: Human Services; Engineering & Planning; Finance and Administrative Services; Public Works; and Public Health & Safety. The Commissioner Director and County Administrator are ex-officio members of each committee.

The position of County Commissioner is considered part-time, although due to the complexity of county government today an increasing amount of time is spent by these elected officials on County business.

The Commissioners employ a full-time Administrator who manages the day-to-day operations of County government. The Clerk of the Board of County Commissioners oversees the work of their offices. Department heads are appointed in accordance with statute and by resolution of the board. As of 2026, Somerset County has 1,061 full-time employees and 119 part-time employees in 46 divisions.

Among the many essential services provided by Somerset County government are higher education, road and bridge maintenance, curbside recycling, parks and recreation, employment training, social services, recording of deeds and wills, public health services, and much more.

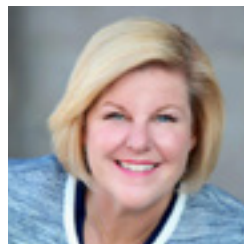

The agency is committed to promoting health, independence, dignity, and choice for Somerset County residents (age 60+), as well as adults (age 18+) with physical disabilities and caregivers in Somerset County by providing access to diverse services. The overarching goal is linking individuals to the programs and services needed to remain independent and active in the community for as long as one can and desires to do so safely. The Nutrition Program encompasses six multipurpose senior centers located in Bridgewater, Somerset, Warren, Hillsborough, Basking Ridge and Montgomery. The Greater Raritan Workforce Development Board (GRWDB), in partnership with the Board of County Commissioners of Hunterdon and Somerset counties, is responsible for planning, policy and oversight of career-related services for employers and job seekers in the two counties. This includes the allocation of approximately \$4 million in federal Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) and state WorkFirst New Jersey funds to help unemployed and underemployed residents being served by the Greater Raritan One-Stop Career Center locations in Somerville and Flemington. Education and training administered through the Greater Raritan One-Stop Career Training Services Center helps eligible job seekers obtain the skills most in-demand by regional employers. Funding is also available for individuals to secure basic skills-enhancement and GED assistance as well as work-readiness training and education for youth ages 16-24. 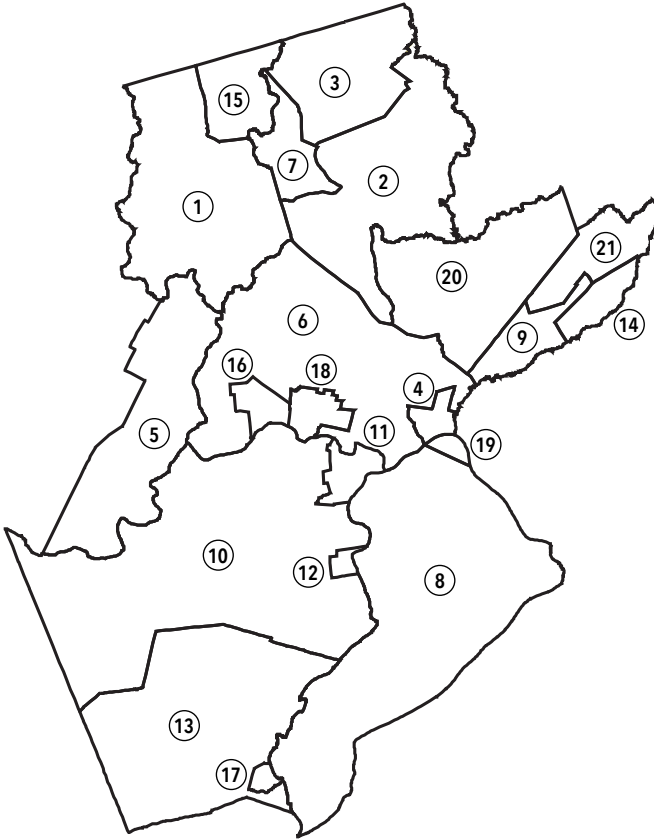

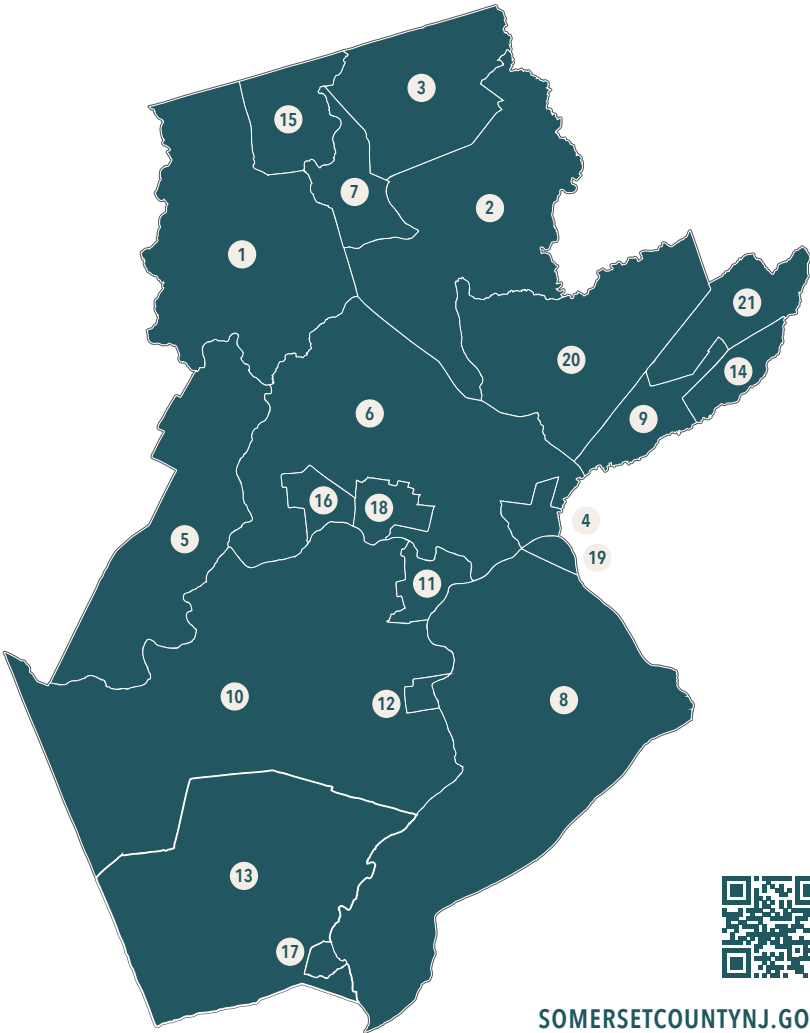
